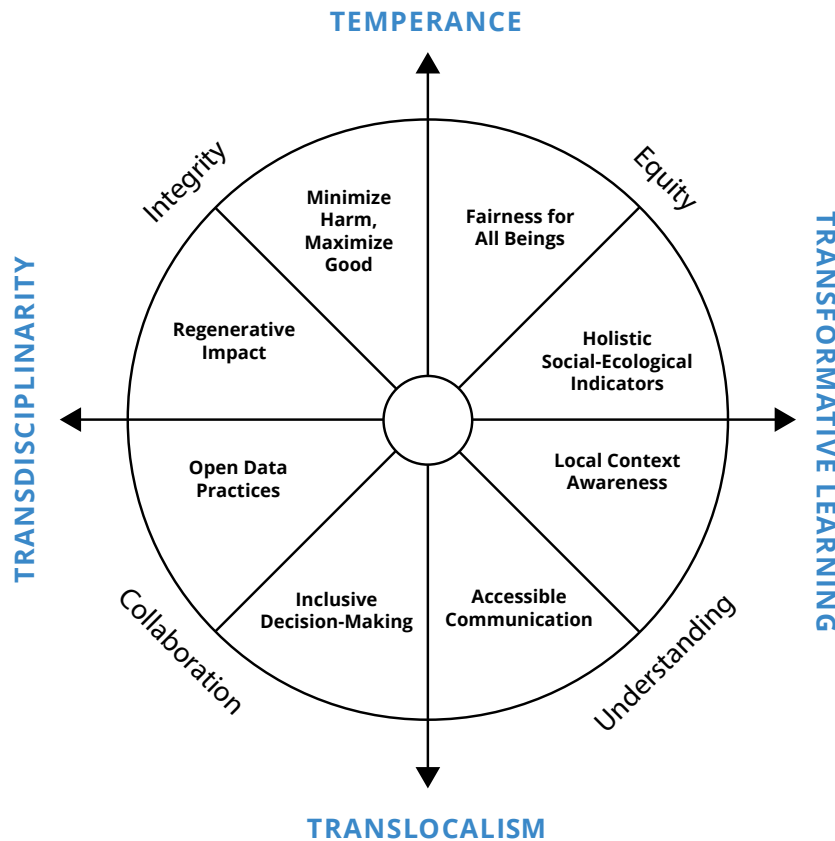


# Transformations Community AI Ethics Manifesto

It aims to guide ethical AI use in sustainability transformations through eight principles that emphasize fairness, regenerative impact, inclusivity, and local context awareness. Designed as a practical compass, this manifesto invites ongoing community reflection to navigate the complex ethical challenges of AI in diverse real-world contexts.

## Guiding Question

How might AI participate in the repair of fractured relationships by supporting multispecies justice and honoring the voices, habitats, and histories of those long marginalized through extraction and erasure?

In what ways might AI accompany the regeneration of living systems by attuning to their rhythms and responding wisely to ecological health over time?

How might AI support the weaving of plural knowledge systems rooted in transparency, local sovereignty, and place-based wisdom?

How might AI be designed to deepen shared responsibility and decision-making among all those entangled in its effects, both seen and unseen?

What would it mean to guide AI in dialogue with diverse sources of wisdom - land-based, ancestral, and non-human - whose presence shapes ethical direction, memory, and meaning?

How might AI support ecological learning through listening and place-based care?

How might we ensure that the benefits of AI intervention outweigh the potential harms, especially for vulnerable ecosystems and communities?

How might AI become explainable through the lived realities, stories, and sensations of those most intimately connected to place?
